## In Memoriam — Diana Sherwood Hagg

It is with deepest regret that we record the first death among our ranks. Our beloved Diana Sherwood Hagg, a charter member of the Pulaski County Historical Society, died August 4, 1953, after an illness of several months. She was 76.

Born in Manistee, Michigan she spent most of her life in Arkansas, and contributed much to the preservation of our local history. Her historical articles, under the by-line of Diana Sherwood, appeared in the magazine sections of both the Democrat and the Gazette.

Her interest in PCHS was evidenced by the fact that in the last weeks of her illness, she took time to send us a letter from the Utley collection, and to arrange for us to use one of her own articles. Both appear in this issue of REVIEW. The last letter she wrote is said to have been a thank-you note to PCHS for the flowers we sent her after our July meeting.

Diana Sherwood has meant a great deal to PCHS, and also to the state association. As organizations, and as individuals, we'll miss her. To her history was fun...and she made it interesting to her readers.
