


The first Little Rock High School, known as Sherman Street High School, was organized in this building at Eighth and Sherman streets in 1869. From this point the high school was transferred to Fourteenth and Scott streets in 1885, thence to Peabody school, West Capitol avenue and Gaines street, in 1890. In 1905 the high school was moved back to Fourteenth and Scott streets, and finally in 1927 to its present location.

Little Rock High School was known as Peabody High School while housed in this building, now Peabody grammar school, at West Capitol avenue and Gaines street.
