



The four pictures shown above were made from old glass negatives now in the picture file in the library of the Arkansas History Commission in the Old State House. The inscription on the envelope in which they are filed indicates the Indians are a LaCrosse team and that the date is about 1890. Nothing more is known of them. The house on the lower right no longer stands. Apparently the present Museum of Natural History shows dimly in the rear. It would be interesting to know more of this team.

The picture on the left shows St. John's College with what appears to be a dormitory in the rear. On the back of the picture is the date, 1860. The College was opened in 1859 but was soon closed by the coming of the Civil War. The president, John B. Thompson at the battle of Shiloh was killed. R. H. Parham was a teacher here after the War and became president in 1872. The buildings stood on a 105 acre tract east of McArthur Park.
