

Born, at Sackett's Harobr, New York on the 25th day of September, A. D. 1835 (1829 is written over this date, and a note in the margin says: "Year changed by Mrs. E. C. Thomson, L. R., May 22, 1911.") Elizabeth Camp Denison, daughter of Leonard Denison and Phoebe Augusta Denison, and 2d wife of Orville Jennings.

Born at Little Rock Arkansas Nov. 20th 1886 Edwin R. Jennings, Son of Chester and Jean Jennings. The above was written on the 34th Birthday of his father and by him.

DEATHS

Died, at Washington, Arkansas, on the 29th day of July, A. D. 1858, at 2 o'clock P. M., of the premature birth of a son, produced by severe attack of bilious fever, Juliet Pauline Jennings, wife of Orville Jennings. She has gone to Heaven - My Angel Wife - May God bless her memory to my good - Her disconsolate husband, Orville.

Died, at Washington, Arkansas, on Wednesday night at 12 o'clock, the 11th day of May, A. D. 1859, of nervous fever and convulsions, after a sickness of 15 days, Laura Ida, third child and daughter of Orville and Juliet P. Jennings. She has gone to her mother.

Died, at his residence, at Little Rock, Ark. on the 2nd day of Oct. A. D. 1866, at 12 A. M., of Cholera, after one night's illness, Orville Jennings, in the 42nd year of his age. He has left a widow (by his second marriage,) and three sons (by his first marriage) to mourn his loss.

Died, at Little Rock, Ark., on Tuesday the 25th day of April 1882; Ernest Jennings, second son of the late Orville & Juliet Pauline Jennings, aged 26 years 9 months & 18 days. -- His disease was consumption -- Ernest led a Christian life & bore his sufferings manfully to the end -- His spirit is with God. -- "Blessed are the pure in heart; for they shall see God."

Died, at Los Angeles Cal, January 20th 1888 Edwin Brittin Jennings eldest son of the late Orville and Juliette P. Jennings age 33 yrs 6 mos and five days - He was a faithful Son a loving and generous brother and died a Christian - His disease was Consumption - He has gone to his reward - Would to God that many lived as he did a self sacrificing life.

Died, at Little Rock, Ark., at his home 1221 Scott St - Chester, fourth child of Orville & Juliette Jennings, at 6 o'clock P. M. the eleventh day of Dec. 1919. His disease, after stroke of Paralysis. A Christian.
