Drss I wish you would render to the Hears all you did with the personal property and real Estate of the Deceased Nathaniel Philbrook all so with the Money from proseades of person property one of your Letters show that you at one time you had between 18000 and twenty thousand dollars in your possession and as you stat all liabeletes in no more clames could be Brought in against the Estate also we find the Decesed had an Intest in the $\frac{1}{2}$ of 640 acres of real Estat in the City of Little Rock and three Tracks of land ajoning the City of Little Rock when I last saw you was four years back on one of the track of land once owned by Nathaniel Philbrook Dec you will remember you was apointed administrat on person property left by dec'd Philbrook your apointment come through Elifled Philbrook the father of Nathn as I hold one thing of all the Clame I wish to be informed how the estate was settled as the hears is combining to test the matter for a settlement I am requested to write you asking you to give us some kind of a statement we are in possession of all the records compleat also your Letters we wish to settle without Law if we can but if we must settle by law you will now find about 40 to contend with Besides myself I was close by you on the Whaley [?] but did not wish to say much
